## Ascension Thursday: A Holy Day of Obligation

Ascension Thursday, also known as the Feast of the Ascension of Our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, is a Holy Day of Obligation for Catholics around the world. On this day, the faithful celebrate Christ's ascension into Heaven on the 40th day after His Resurrection. Depending on the year, this day falls between May 13 and June 16.

Like other Holy Days of Obligation, parishioners are encouraged to spend the day in prayer and contemplation. Holy Days, also called Feast Days, have traditionally been celebrated with food, so some faithful also observe the day with a picnic to commemorate.

In the Eastern Church this feast is known in Greek as Analepsis, the "taking up", and also as the Episozomene, the "Salvation from on high", denoting that by ascending into his glory Christ completed the work of our redemption.

# <u>Interesting Facts About the Catholic Church You Probably</u> <u>Didn't Know</u>

The Swiss Papal Guard protects the Pope. Wearing uniforms designed by Michelangelo and commonly armed with halberds (two-handed pole weapons), they are capable of using heavier weapons if needed. Each member is Catholic, male, and Swiss, and must complete military training in Switzerland. They must demonstrate good conduct and be at least five-foot-eight in height. Upon admission, new recruits meet the pope privately with their families. The Swiss Papal Guard is the oldest active military unit in continual existence since 1506. They are willing to give their lives for the Pope, in extreme circumstances.
