Can a priest reveal what he has heard to others?

No. A priest can never reveal the sins a person has confessed. This is known as the "Seal of Confession," which admits of no exceptions (CCC 1467).

If a priest were to violate the seal of confession he would be automatically excommunicated (CIC 1388).

Over the centuries several priests have died, and many have been imprisoned because they refused, even under threat of torture and execution, to break the inviolable seal of confession.

This is one of the most beautiful aspects of the sacrament and of the priesthood: the priest who hears our confession, in order to protect the secrets, we have whispered to God through him, will allow himself to be imprisoned, tortured or even killed.

That's how seriously he and the Church take the seal and the sacrament.

The Blessing of Homes

Blessing of the homes is done each year on or after the feast of Theophany. This act is the central sign of God's sanctification of all things through Christ's baptism in the river Jordan and His Epiphany to the world.

When the priest comes, all who are present in the house should gather around the icon with the candle and a bowl of water. They should, if they are able to join in and sing of the Troparion of the Feast of Epiphany. Then a family member leads the priest through the house with the candle. As the priest goes, he sprinkles holy water, and prays for a blessing upon each room and the activity that goes on there. When they have gone through the entire house, the family gathers again around the table and the priest blesses each person present.

General guidelines should be observed:

- A candle with an icon and some holy water should be put in a suitable place
- •Also, a list of first names for whom prayers are to be offered, including members of the family and all those living in the house.
- •If it is the practice to give the priest a gift, it should not be placed with the holy objects on the table. It can be prepared in advanced but given at the conclusion of the service, preferably in an envelope or a card.
